Letter to all parents and carers of students at The John Frost School

Dear Parent/Carer

I am writing to inform you of important details and to extend a special welcome to our Year 7 students who will be joining us in September.

Important information you will need for September:

Friday 1 September INSET – school closed for students

Monday 4 September Y7 only in school
Tuesday 5 September Y7 – Y11 in school
Wednesday 6 September Y12 Transition Morning
Thursday 7 September Y12 and Y13 lessons begin
Friday 8 September Y7 & Y10 school photographs

This phased approach will allow us to safely welcome all students back into school and prepare them for the new term.

- 2. School Uniform We are very proud of our reputation for excellent uniform and all students should be wearing full John Frost School uniform when they return in September. PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

- > Black shoes only are to be worn (sensible style for all day comfort and safety; trainers are not allowed)
- > Jewellery (other than studs in the ear) is not allowed for health and safety reasons this includes facial piercings.
- > Students can wear black or grey **opaque** tights or grey knee-high socks with a skirt.
- If your child has an extreme haircut, please ensure that this grows out before September. The same applies to brightly dyed hair. The Headteacher has the final say on this.
- Make-up can be worn; however, it needs to be natural and suitable for a professional workplace. No false eyelashes or excessive make-up is permitted.
- Nail varnish can be worn; however, it must be a discreet colour. Nails must be a short, safe length so as not to cause injury to self or others. NO false nails or extensions are permitted as this breaches health and safety.
- 3. School Bags These should be dark, plain and big enough to carry all equipment. They should not be bright/logoed fashion accessories.

4. Exam Results

A level Results Day - Thursday 17 August 2023 – 9.00am to midday

All Year 12 and 13 results for GCE (AS and A2); BTECS; LIBF and Welsh Baccalaureate will be available to collect from school between 9.00am - midday. Destination support and support for those who will need to go through clearing will be available in school from 9.00am to midday. Students who are unable to attend will be emailed results to their Hwb account in the afternoon.

GCSE Results Day - Thursday 24 August 2022 – 9.00am to midday

All Year 11 (and Year 10) results for GCSEs; BTECS; LIBF; NCFE; Agored Cymru and Welsh Baccalaureate will be available to collect from school between 9.00am-midday. Mr Shinton and Mr Underwood will be available from 9.00am to midday to sign students on to the Sixth Form. Support will also be available for any students who fall short of entry requirements. **Year 11** students who are unable to attend will have their results emailed to their Hwb account in the afternoon. Year 10 students who are unable to attend will be able to collect their results from Student Reception when they return to school in September.

- 5. Parents must use ParentPay (our cashless method) to pay for school meals. There is no option to pay for school lunch by cash or to top up a dinner card using the Revalue Machine. Parents/carers can also pay for school trips via our ParentPay site. If you have not yet registered for ParentPay, please contact Mrs Watkins, WatkinsT50@Hwbcymru.net who will provide you with details of how to do this.

- 7. Free school meals entitlement are for students who attend school full-time; this includes sixth form students. Please note that students who return to Y12 and Y13 will have to make a new application if they wish to continue to have free school meals. Your child may be eligible if you get any of the following:
- Income Support or Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (the annual income must be less than £16,190 for the household)
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- National Asylum Seekers Support Benefit
- Universal Credit up until March 2019;
- From 1 April 2019, Universal Credit, provided the household have an annualised net earned income of no more than £7400, (as assessed by earnings from up to three of the most recent assessment periods).

It is important to the school that all those entitled to claim meals do so, even if your child only eats lunch in school a few times in the year. The school receives additional funding for free school meals, which will be spent on your child's education. To apply please follow this link:

- If you want to check your child is already on the list, please telephone Main Reception (654100) from Monday 4 September onwards.
- If you are claiming for the first time and need help with filling in the application form, please contact the school.
- Applications can be made at any time during the year if there is a change in circumstances. Complete the online application form.
- Application forms can be downloaded for you in school (in term time) or from Newport City Council (outside of term time) by telephoning 01633 656656.
- Applications should ideally arrive no later than the end of the summer term so that they can be processed for the start of the new school year.

What other support is available?

Families that have traditionally qualified for free school meals can still access additional support but must apply to the Council.

8. Please can all parents ensure we have an accurate contact number and email address in case of an emergency and to ensure you receive all school correspondence. Can parents of our Year 7 students ensure they have completed the online forms, which have been sent by email. If you have not received an email, please contact the school.

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Y7 students should report to the main hall on their first day. There will be staff on hand to meet them. Y7 students can use the canteen from their very first day, though some may like to bring a packed lunch for the first few weeks while they are getting used to their new surroundings and we do recommend this where possible.

A final plea for parents to get involved in the PTA. Please remember, this is your school – help us to make it even better; with your input our students will achieve even more!

I hope you have a safe and enjoyable summer and we look forward to welcoming our students to school in September.
